Recipe of the Month Tuna Salad Nicoise

A simple easy salad to make and can be made with salmon, tinned, fresh or frozen Tuna. I have used frozen tuna from Sainsbury, allowed it to thaw then cooked it in a griddle pan. The simplicity and beauty of this dish is that all the ingredients can be prepared well ahead in the day and just brought together for the final serving.

Ingredients for two people

Tuna or salmon 2 pieces

150g of fresh tomatoes on the vine

2tbs Olive Oil

4 tbs of good quality vinegar

2 soft hard boiled eggs (9 mins) cut in four

100g French beans cut in half boiled and cooked

Black olives 12 or as many as you like cut in thin slices

200g of new potatoes boiled and cooked allowed to go cold cut in slices or diced

Anchovy fillets (I always use the whole tin) keep the oil from the tin to dress the salad

Method:

Combine all the ingredients except the eggs into a bowl. You may wish to tear the anchovy fillets or use a knife to chop them up if you prefer. Drizzle with the anchovy and olive oil and add the vinegar. Season with salt and pepper. Toss well. Plate the nicoise salad onto a plate. Arrange the egg around the corners and finish by placing your fish on top.
